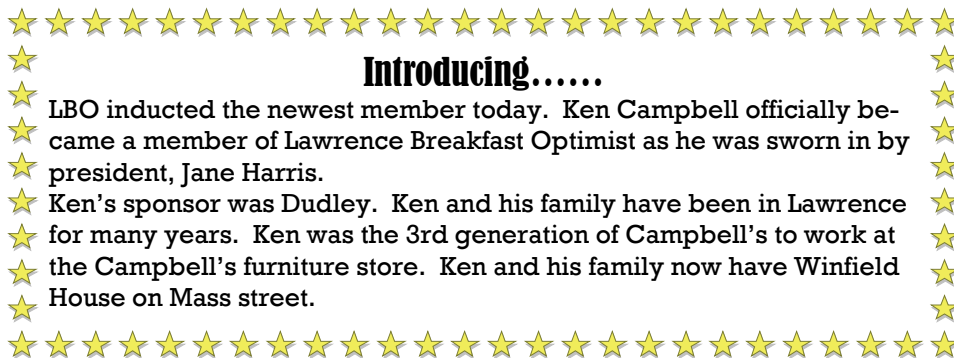

THE PROGRAM

Homelessness in Lawrence has recently made many headlines in the Lawrence Journal World. This morning's guest speaker is familiar with the homelessness issues in Lawrence. Joe Reitz, with Family Promise of Lawrence provided insight into the program that assists families that have lost their homes and their livelihood. Family Promise of Lawrence transforms the lives of youth just as the Optimist do. Family Promise is a non profit organization that works with homeless families with children. The program offers shelter, food, transportation, training, counseling, medical care and other assistance for families and their children. Faith congregations across Lawrence have joined in partnership with Family Promise to provide shelter for the families to stay the night. During the day families spend time in a house working with the director to identify the reasons that the family is in their current situation and to work toward



solutions that will get them out of the current state of homelessness. Currently 13 churches in Lawrence serve as hosts for the families. The host churches also provide volunteers to assist the families and children during their stay at the church. Volunteers offer care and compassion and give the families some one to talk with and share with. Family Promise provides a safe, homelike atmosphere for families to work on skills and secure resources for their future. Family Promise does not accept any government or United Way funds. Family Promise is hosting a golf tournament and auction on Sunday, September 20th and Monday, September 21. For more information visit www.lawrencefamilypromise.org.
